Keynote Adress: Equity In Mental Health: Bridging Gaps across Generations

Speaker : Dr Goh Chee Leong

Chief Executive Officer, HELP University Leader, Educator, Psychologist and Coach.

Dr Goh currently serves as the CEO for HELP Education Services and also serves as the Dean of the Faculty of Behavioral Sciences which houses one of the largest Psychology programs in South East Asia. He obtained his PhD in Psychology from the University of Otago and has served as the project leader for several UNICEF interventions in Malaysia, including a bully prevention intervention in Malaysian schools and a positive discipline initiative in schools. He has served as a consultant and facilitator with Ogilvy and Mather, Petronas, Maxis, MISC, CIMB, Public Mutual, Prudential, Standard Chartered Bank, Digi, Great Eastern, Kraft, Sime Darby, Bank Negara, Prudential, Hitachi, Mimos, Toyota and BASF. His areas of specialization include the application of psychology to change management, conflict mediation, customer service, people management, stress management, talent management and leadership.

Dr. Nicholas Pang Tze Ping is an associate professor in psychiatry at Universiti Malaysia Sabah. With a background in clinical psychiatry, Dr. Pang has dedicated his career to advancing our understanding of mental health and well-being. His work often focuses on areas such as mindfulness-based interventions, seeing ACT and DBT applied in research contexts in areas as wide ranging as alcohol addiction and perinatal populations. He is also founding secretary of the Association of Contextual Behaviour Sciences Malaysia chapter and is co-organiser of the International Society of Quality of Life Conference in Sabah, 2024.

Dr. Nurashikin Ibrahim, a medical doctor and Public Health Medicine Specialist has been in service at Ministry of Health for the past 28 years Her areas of expertise/knowledge are in Mental Health Promotion Mental Health Services and Psychosocial Support Disaster and Suicide Prevention upon which she received training in Psychosocial Response to Disaster from Hyogo Institute of Traumatic Stress, (HITS) Japan as well as training in Mental Health Promotion & Mental Illness Prevention from Hunter Institute of Mental Health, Australia and Suicide Prevention from AISRAP, Australia.

She is also responsible as Head Coordinator of the Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services of Ministry of Health in response to the COVID-19 pandemic in Malaysia and has been involved in many past crisis situations including the unprecedented incident of air tragedy MH370 and MH17 in 2014, Humanitarian Mission for the Rohingya's in 2017 and recent massive flood tragedy in 2021. She has received several awards among them, Ahli Mahkota Wilayah in 2015, the Excellence Service Medal in 2016, and most recently The Heart of Gold Award from PERKAMA International in 2022 for being an active civil servant in "Strategies Addressing Mental Health in Malaysia".
